- ✓ You may enroll in courses before being admitted to the certificate. 45 credits required for admission to the Certificate. - ✓ All courses in the Certificate must be completed with a grade of C- or better. Courses must be taken for a letter grade (A-F grading basis). The cumulative GPA for all certificate courses must be 2.00 or higher.
- ✓ You can apply up to 40% of transferable, department-approved coursework from other educational institutions toward the certificate.
- ✓ Certificate coursework must be completed within four years of admission to the certificate.
- ✓ To be awarded a certificate, you must submit the Application for Degree, which can be found online at onestop.umn.edu/onestop/graduating.html

*Introduction to Construction can be waived with faculty director approval for those students working within the construction industry. However, a total of 19 credits must be earned for the certificate.
